*Walk in silence and assemble in front of Castle Green for a short devotion. The congregation follow the Altar Party, receiving a Palm Cross at the door, and assemble on the Green facing the Cross and Altar Party.*

**Priest** Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us accompany him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

## THE PALM GOSPEL

As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!' Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'

## **KNEEL OR SIT**

*The priest recites the Eucharistic prayer. A bell signals the elevation of the consecrated bread and wine, at which all may make the sign of the cross.*

*After the elevation of the consecrated wine, the following acclamation is said:*

**Priest** Christ is the bread of life.

**All** **When we eat this bread and drink this cup,  
we proclaim thy death, Lord Jesus, until thou comest in glory.**

*The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer, concluding with:*

by whom and with whom, and in whom,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee,  
O Father almighty, world without end.

## **THE LORD'S PRAYER (SUNG)**

*Communion is administered in both kinds (bread and wine). If you do not wish to receive wine from the common cup, please leave the altar rail immediately after you have consumed the bread. Please note that intinction (dipping the wafer into the consecrated wine) is not permitted.*

*Words of distribution are used to which the communicant replies: Amen.*
