THE NICENE CREED (SUNG)

He suffered and was burièd, and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father.

And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead: whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshippèd and glorified, who spake by the prophets. And I believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And I look for the resurrection of the dead, ★ and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE OFFERTORY

During the Offertory Hymn, the gifts of the people are gathered and presented in the Collection. **NEH 104**

- AT the Lamb's high feast we sing Praise to our victorious King: Who hath washed us in the tide Flowing from his piercèd side; Praise we him whose love divine Gives the guests his blood for wine, Gives his body for the feast, Love the Victim, Love the Priest.
- Where the Paschal blood is poured, Death's dark angel sheathes his sword; Israel's hosts triumphant go Through the wave that drowns the foe. Christ, the Lamb whose blood was shed, Paschal victim, Paschal bread! With sincerity and love Eat we Manna from above.
- Mighty Victim from on high, Powers of hell beneath thee lie; Death is broken in the fight, Thou hast brought us life and light. Now thy banner thou dost wave, Conquering Satan and the grave. See the prince of darkness quelled; Heaven's bright gates are open held.
- Paschal triumph, Paschal joy, Only sin can this destroy; From sin's death do thou set free, Souls re-born, dear Lord, in thee. Hymns of glory, songs of praise, Father, unto thee we raise. Risen Lord, all praise to thee, Ever with the Spirit be.

As each element is received the following may be said:

- Priest Blessed art thou, Lord God of all creation: through thy goodness we have this bread to set before thee, which earth hath given and human hands have made. It will become for us the bread of life.
- All Blessed be God for ever.
- Priest Blessed art thou, Lord God of all creation: through thy goodness we have this wine to set before thee, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation.
- All Blessed be God for ever.
- Priest Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.
- All May the Lord accept the sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his Name, for our good and the good of all his Church.

A Proper Preface may be used when appropriate. The priest then concludes with:

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name, evermore praising thee and singing:

 All (Sung) Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts, Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high.
 ✤ Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

KNEEL OR SIT

The priest recites the Eucharistic prayer. A bell signals the elevation of the consecrated bread and wine, at which all may make the sign of the cross.

After the elevation of the consecrated wine, the following acclamation is said:

- Priest Great is the mystery of faith.
- All Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

The priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer, concluding with:

by whom and with whom, and in whom,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee,

- O Father almighty, world without end.
- All Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER (SUNG)

Priest As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to say:

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

Priest We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.All Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

AGNUS DEI (SUNG)

All O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

The priest invites the people to communion:

Priest Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof, but speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.

Communion is administered in both kinds (bread and wine). If you do not wish to receive wine from the common cup, please leave the altar rail immediately after you have consumed the bread. Please note that intinction (dipping the wafer into the consecrated wine) is not permitted.

Words of distribution are used to which the communicant replies: Amen.

During the giving of communion the choir will sing the following hymn. Members of the congregation are invited to join in if they wish.
